ALL ABOUT PET MICE

By Ella Plansky

I have two pet mice. I used to have three, but one of them, (Linka) died. Three is an ideal number of mice to have because if you have two mice, one of them might bully the other one, and if you only have one it could get lonely. Any more than three mice and you would need a pretty big cage. Three mice need about a 20x10 floor space in their cage. If you have shelves in their cage they do not count for floor space. You should not have a wire mesh bottom on your cage because it makes it harder for your mice to get around, (especially when they get old).

If your cage is made of wire or metal with holes in it, the holes should be no bigger than 1/4 inch because smaller mice could squeeze out. Also, wild mice

could squeeze through the holes and breed with your mice.

Some mice can chew through plastic, but mine never have.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF CAGES

Glass Tanks-----

Glass tanks are a good cage for mice so long as they have good ventilation on the top. You can do that by putting holes in the top of the lid, (very small holes, and lots of them) or by making a wooden frame with wire mesh in the middle that sits on the top of the cage in place of the lid.

Wire cages-----

I talked a bit about these already. The holes must be 1/4 inch or smaller, and the bottom should not be made of wire.

Homemade Plastic Bin Cages-----

This is what I have for my mice. They are cheap and easy to make. You make them by cutting out rectangular sections from the top and sides of a plastic bin and replacing it with wire mesh for ventilation.

Like I said; some mice can chew through plastic, but mine haven't even tried.

Overall I think this is a pretty good cage.

BEDDING

The floor of you mouse cage should be completely covered in bedding.

I have given my mice a brand of paper bedding called Carefresh. The mice liked it, but you can also just rip up or shred normal paper, which the mice like and is cheaper.

For a while I gave my mice aspen wood shavings as bedding, but it seemed to make them very itchy, so I wouldn't advise that.

I like to mix dried grass called timothy hay (which you can buy at pet stores) in with their bedding because they like to nest in it and it is edible.

FOOD AND WATER

I feed my mice a mixture of dog food, birdseed, and oats, but you can also buy lab blocks and other mouse food online or at some pet stores.

I tried feeding them to my mice because they are good for mice but my mice didn't really like them.

Mice like variety in their food. You can occasionally give them a piece of vegetable or a raw, unsalted nut. (My

mice's favorites are almonds and spinach. They don't really like cheese.)

For water you can put a pet water bottle on their cage. It's not good for mice to be wet, so don't give them a water bowl or they might climb in it.

WHEELS

The flying saucer-----

An odd wheel, but safer than most, costing between 5\$ and 15\$ depending on size and where you buy it. Mine worked great until I lost one of the pieces.

The Silent Spinner-----

I have a Silent Spinner wheel for my mice now, but for some reason it has stopped spinning. It was very hard to turn, like it needed oiling (which, by the way, you should only do with olive oil or vegetable oil because other oil could

poison your mice). So we oiled it and it didn't work, but it was good up until then.

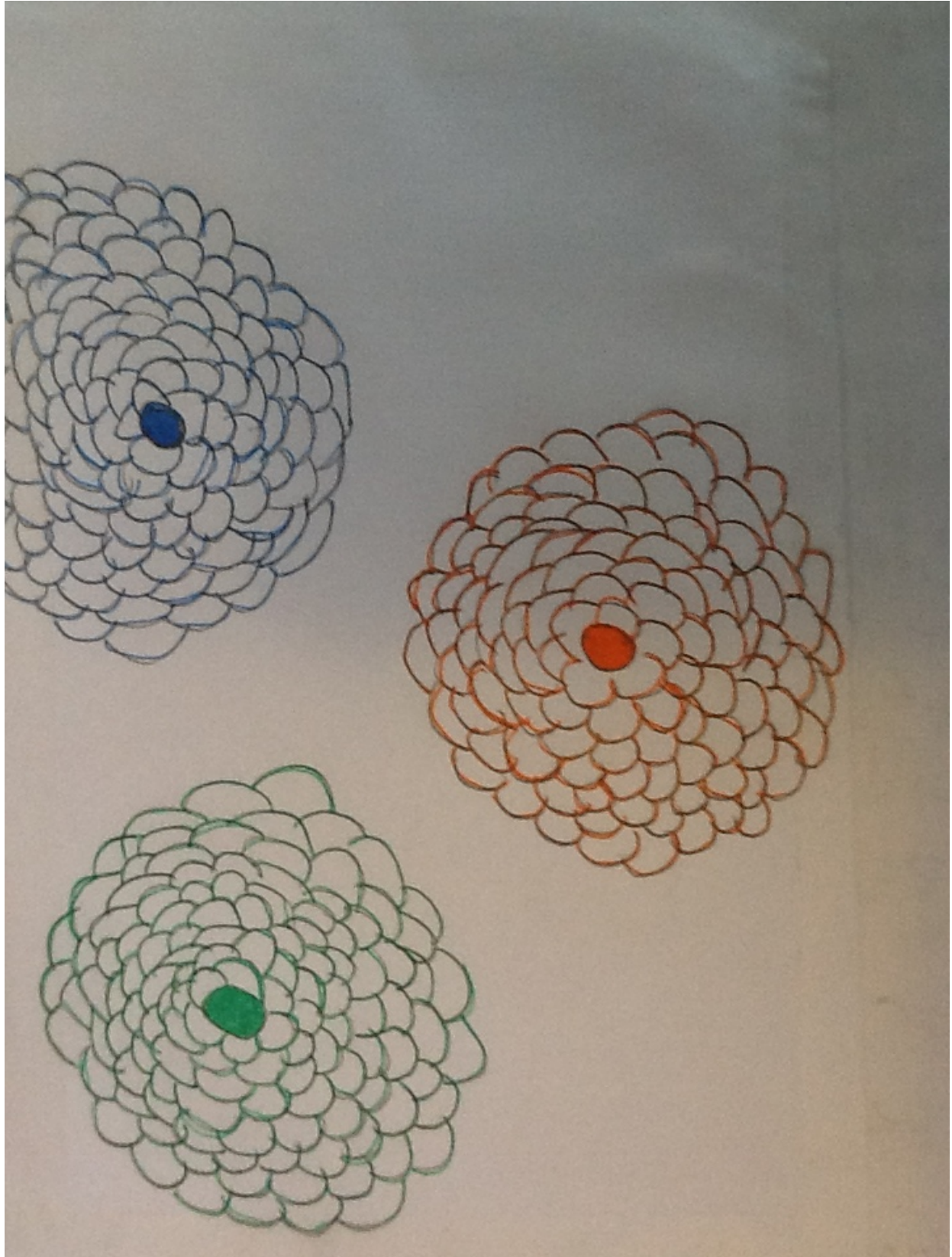

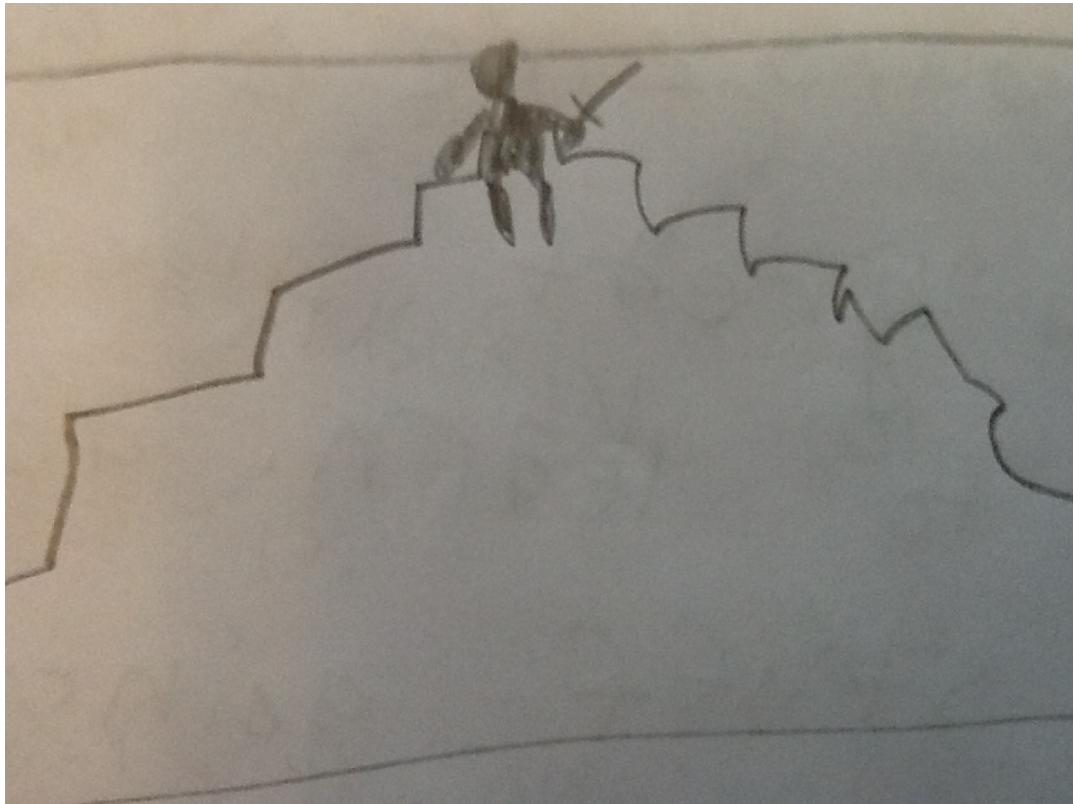

Stories of Zynara By Ella Plansky

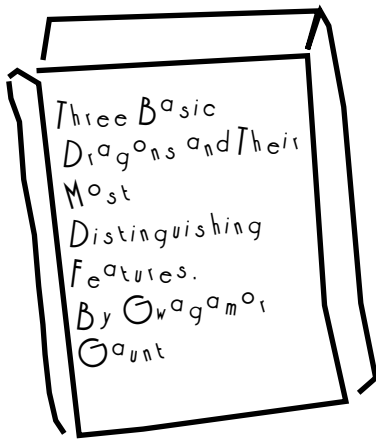

Modexa
